Why the Bible is Important in Determining God's Will

"All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." 2 Timothy 3:16-17 and the Expressed Will of God

Why is it essential that we believe God inspired all Scripture?

"Inspiration simply means that all words of the Bible are God's Words."

What is means did God use to breath His Words? (Jeremiah 1:9; 2 Peter 1:20-21)

Does the fact that God used men to record his words make scripture any less reliable or authoritative?

"Behold, I have put My words in your mouth" **Jeremiah 1:9**

"...no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit."

2 Peter 1:20-21

"In cases where the ordinary human personality and writing style of the author were prominently involved, as seems the case with the major part of Scripture, all that we are able to say is that God's providential oversight and direction of the life of each author was such that their personalities, their backgrounds and training, their abilities to evaluate events in the world around them, their access to historical data, their judgment with regard to the accuracy of information, and their individual circumstances when they wrote, were all exactly what God wanted them to be, so that when they actually came to the point of putting pen to paper, the words were fully their words but also fully the words that God wanted them to write, words that God would also claim as his own."
